

## We're introducing more out-door dining opportunities in our city.

Our local businesses are the life blood of our community, adding to the vibrancy and the city's welcoming culture. These changes are expected to boost trade and bring new life into our city streets.

The City of Maribyrnong, known for its foodie culture and love of celebrating, is creating more out-door dining opportunities for residents to safely enjoy the city's restaurant and café scene in a COVID-19 environment.

While restrictions may be easing, it's still not business as usual for traders with physical distancing continuing to restrict the number of patrons at restaurants and cafes. That's why Council is working with businesses to increase their footprint outside, enabling an increased number of patrons to dine at a safe 1.5 metre distance from each other.

This includes the introduction of out-door dining in streets that will be opened to increased pedestrian traffic but closed to cars.

The new out-door dining opportunities will be introduced over the next few months.

Other initiatives will be progressively rolled-out as businesses apply and conditions are met including road safety audits, providing COVID-19 Safe Plans and supporting documentation that makes this a positive and safe experience for everyone.

**Ballarat Street, Yarraville**


**Ballarat Street between Canterbury Street and Anderson Street.**
