Definitions

Vulnerability – children are vulnerable if the capacity of parents and family to effectively care, protect and provide for their long term development and wellbeing is limited*. Some factors, which may contribute to a child being vulnerable, include:

- Living in a family with low income or one which is experiencing problems with housing, domestic violence, substance abuse or mental health;
- Having a culturally and linguistically diverse background with demonstrated support needs
- Having a young or single parent, or
- A parent with a disability.

High Support/Additional Needs refers to children that:

- · Require additional assistance in order to fully participate in an early childhood program
- Require a combination of services which are individually planned, or
- Have an identified specific disability or developmental delay.

Disability in Family

Priority is provided to children of families that include a person with disability. That means there is:

- Significant risk of serious injury to self or others
- Extremely restricted capacity for movement
- Exceptional support needs that require immediate medical intervention for life threatening situations.
