What are gender stereotypes?

Gender describes masculinity and femininity and refers to the socially learnt roles, behaviours, activities and attributes that any given society considers appropriate for men and women; boys and girls.

Gender stereotypes are broadly accepted ideas about the way males and females should behave. Common gender stereotypes include that men shouldn't cry; that females are naturally caring and emotional; that boys like trucks, sport and want to be superheroes; and that girls like dolls and aspire to be princesses.





Rigid gender stereotyping promotes inequality between the sexes and can set children up to expect and accept power imbalances within relationships later in life. Presenting children with positive and diverse representations of gender teaches them that anything is possible and

- Do female and male characters in the story have the same opportunities?
- When characters have nonstereotypical qualities or interests, is this portrayed as something normal and is it welcomed?
