

Native indigenous plant list for the Maribyrnong Garden

The survival of native wildlife in our city depends on healthy native vegetation communities. One way to support your local ecology and biodiversity is to create a native garden.

When planning a native garden, it is best to include a range of different types of local native plants such as vines, ground covers, shrubs and trees which provide the food, shelter and other resources native animals need. Massed plantings of just one or two species are generally not wildlife friendly as these gardens lack the diversity of food and other resources needed by native wildlife.

Maribyrnong City Council have listed a selection of indigenous plants that residents can use to create a native garden.
