Sensory accessibility

Sight

- Most rooms have bright white and natural lighting. Spaces are generally neutral, though some areas may feel more stimulating during activities or displays.

Sound

- Noise levels vary depending on activities, with sound carrying between rooms. No designated quiet space is available, though staff can assist if a quieter area is needed. No sound-absorbing features throughout the venue.

Air

- Heating and cooling are adjustable in most rooms. No air purifiers are provided, and there are no noticeable scents.



Mobility

How venue features cater to people with mobility access needs through accessible paths, toilets, and parking.

Mobility accessibility

Step-free access

- Step-free throughout the venue and from the car park, with four accessible parking spaces. Paths are flat.

Entrances and bathrooms

- The main entrance has automatic sliding doors (17500 mm wide). One RH accessible toilet is available.

Doorways

- Doorways vary in width, with the narrowest at 810 mm (Training Room). Rooms generally allow flexible layouts.

How venues enable communication for d/Deaf or hard of hearing people with captions, devices, and Auslan.

Hearing accessibility

Hearing loops

- Hearing loops are not available in this venue.

Visual supports

- Wayfinding signage is not currently installed. Room signage is positioned above doorways and may be less visible for some users.

Auslan access

- Staff do not have formal Auslan training but are welcoming and happy to assist where possible.

Vision accessibility

Tactile wayfinding

- Tactile ground surface indicators are not available inside or outside the venue.

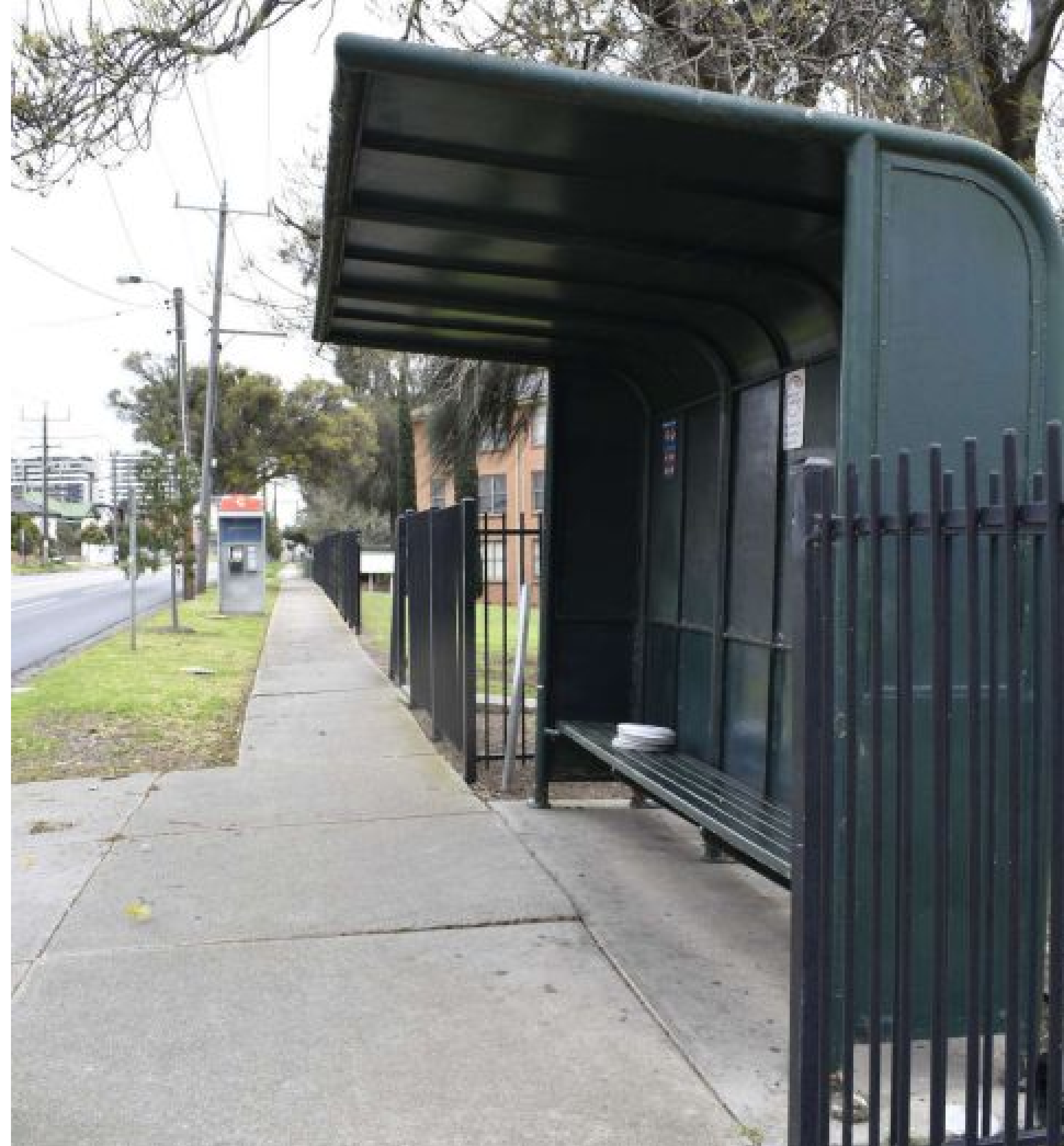
Signage

- Wayfinding signage is not currently installed. Room signage is positioned above doorways. Braille is provided on toilet doors and emergency exit signs.

Guide dog friendly

- The venue is guide dog friendly. Staff are happy to provide water for guide dogs, and grass areas are available around the venue.

Getting here



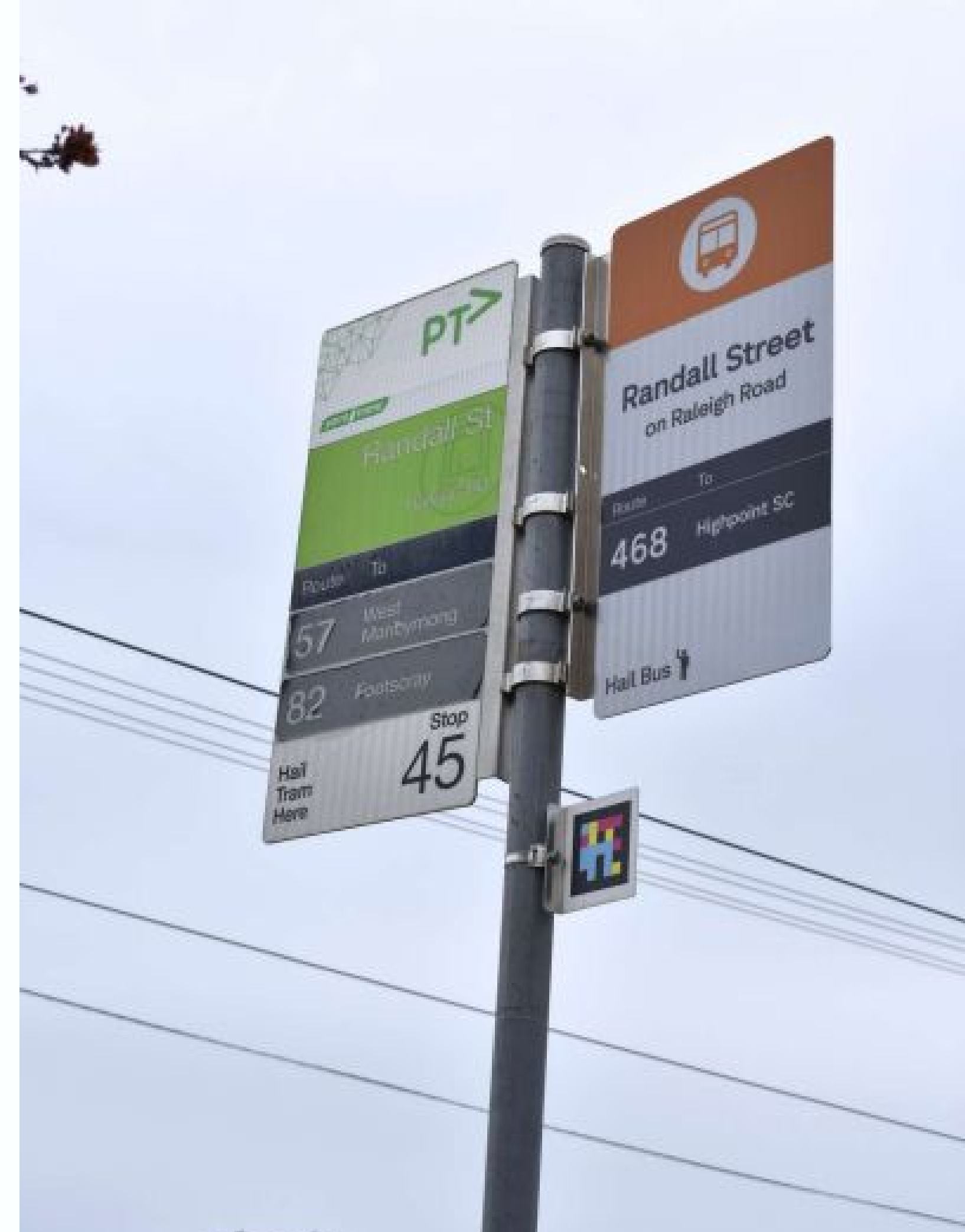
Accessible parking

- Visitors can access the car park via 9 Randall Street.
- The car park provides 4 designated accessible parking spaces.
- From the car park, the entrance is approximately 50 metres away, reached by a flat and step-free pathway.



Public transport

- The nearest bus stop is Rendall Street on Raleigh Road, located about 240 metres from the main entrance, serviced by bus route 468.
- This stop is also serviced by tram routes 57 and 82, however these services are not step-free.
- Access between the stop and the main entrance is flat and step-free.



Entrance

- Visitors can enter using a step-free path with a slightly uneven brick paving surface and grass areas nearby.
- A single handrail is available outside the entrance; tactile markers are not provided.
- Entry is via automatic sliding double doors, 1750 mm wide.



Accessibility features



RH Accessible toilet

- One right-hand (RH) accessible bathroom is located next to Sandy's Room.
- Entry is through a heavy manual door with a manual lock and a 900 mm clear width.
- The grab rail extends behind the toilet, and under-sink knee clearance is 680 mm.



Large print keyboard

- A large print keyboard (ZoomText, black on yellow) is available for visitors with low vision in ESL/Training Room.
- It features oversized, high-contrast characters to improve visibility and reduce eye strain.

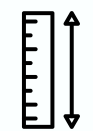


Access features by space



Foyer and Reception

Open entrance area featuring a variety of soft seating options.

 Open access: 1950 mm width

Key features:



- Large, open space
- Multiple rest points and soft seating options



- Bright white overhead lighting with strong natural light
- Activities board is visually stimulating

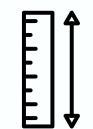


- Sound leakage from hall



Hall

Large open space used for gatherings and events, connecting directly to the dining room, kitchen, and kitchenette via bifold doors.

 Entry access: 1850 mm width

Key features:



- Large, open space
- Two steps to dais with left and right handrails



- Bright white overhead lighting with strong natural light



- Sounds may feel loud due to hard surfaces and flooring



Kitchen

Compact preparation areas supporting community cooking and dining activities.

↕ Entry access via hall: 1200 mm width
↕ Bench heights range from 880–920 mm

Key features:



- Wide pathways
- Open walkway to dining area and hall



- Bright white overhead lighting with strong natural light
- Navy, white, and yellow colour scheme

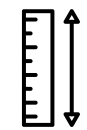


- Sound leakage from hall



Dining Area

Open communal dining space connecting directly to the kitchen, kitchenette, and hall via bifold doors.



Access from kitchen via open walkway (1050 mm clearance)

Key features:



- Flexible room layout
- Open walkway to kitchen and hall



- Bright white overhead lighting with strong natural light
- Visually stimulating

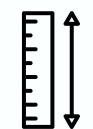


- Sound leakage from hall



Training Room

Comfortable and adaptable space designed for training and workshops, equipped with 9 computers, a projector, and flexible seating layout.

 Entry access width: 810 mm

Key features:



- Flexible room layout
- Soft chairs on rollers with lumbar support and height adjustment



- Bright white overhead lighting with strong natural light
- Block out blinds available
- Large print keyboard available



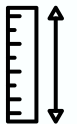
- Sound leakage from hall and corridor

Notes: Overhead ceiling fan for additional air circulation



Sandy's Room

Multipurpose room with a kitchenette and adjustable furniture, suitable for parents, small groups, or general community use.

 Entry access width: 1680 mm
 Kitchenette benchtops: 910 mm height

Key features:



- Flexible room layout
- Low-pile carpet flooring



- Bright white overhead lighting with strong natural light
- Block out blinds available



- Sound leakage from hall and corridor

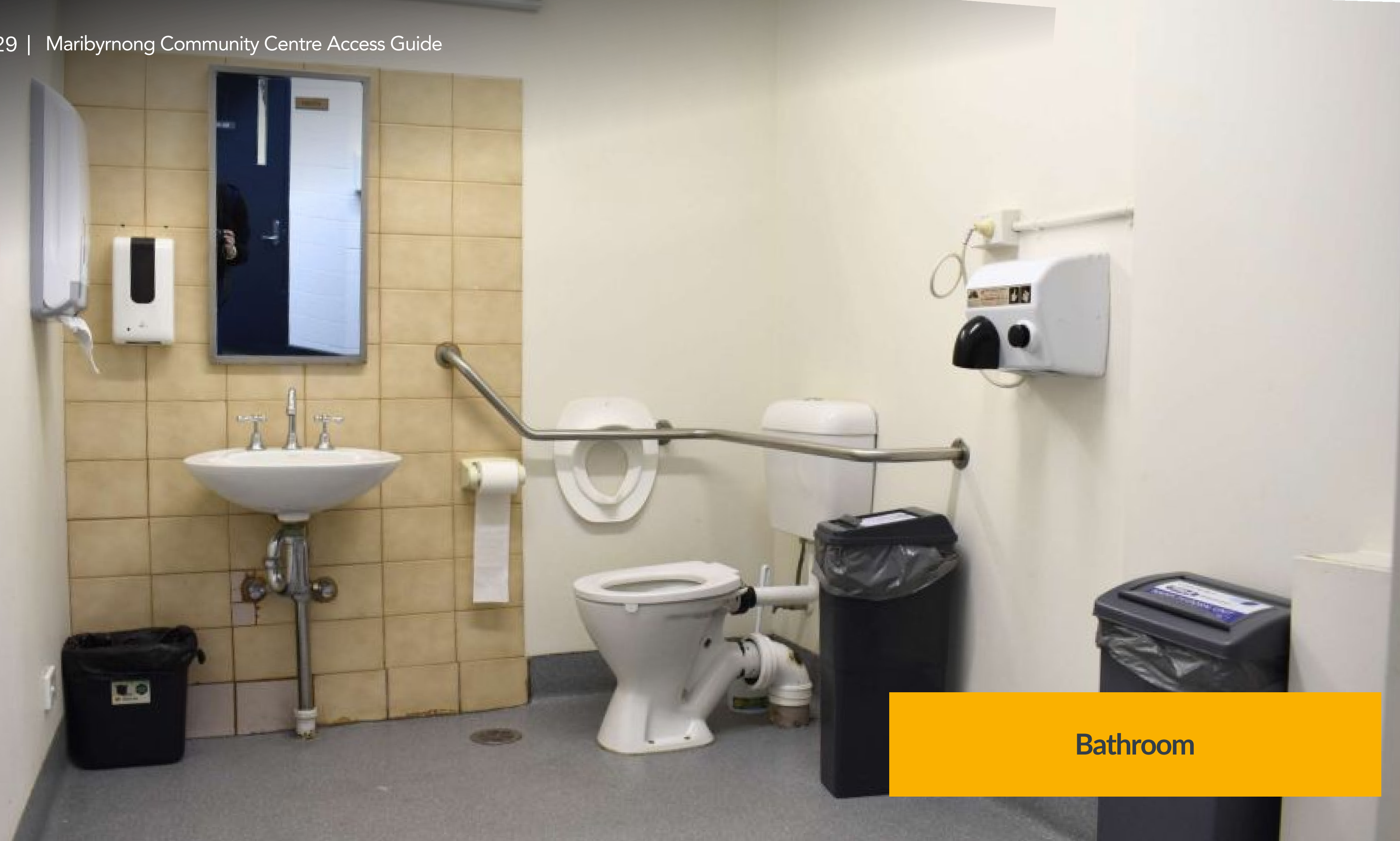

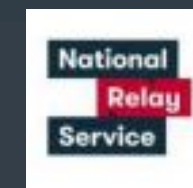
