Launch event: Property Flood Risk Cards and the Neighbourhood Flood Network



Thank you to everyone who joined us to launch the Property Flood Risk Cards and Neighbourhood Flood Network.

The cards provide property-specific flood risk information to residents at risk of flooding in the Maribyrnong Township.

The event provided an opportunity to hear from members of the Community Recovery Committee (CRC), Maribyrnong Neighbourhood Flood Network and Maribyrnong Catchment Resilience Association.

It also provided an opportunity to receive a pack if you were not home during the recent door knocks and ask questions.

How to collect your pack if you were not home during the door knock

If were not home, you should have received a postcard in your mailbox with the details to book a follow-up appointment for your household, neighbours or community group.

Mighty Stories, Mighty Community event

Held in partnership with Moonee Valley City Council, this community event marks three years since the Maribyrnong River Flood in 2022 with the screening of a series of films about community stories and experiences.

The event is free, family-friendly, and will feature food trucks and kids' activities. It will also feature an artist talk on the Coulson Gardens public artwork, another project designed to capture the experiences of the Maribyrnong community.

Update: public art installation

Installation for the community stories artwork in Coulson Gardens is scheduled to be installed from Wednesday 1 October. Installation is estimated to take five business days (weather depending).

During this time, sections of the path will be restricted. Bollards and hoarding will be used to protect the artwork. The rest of Coulson Gardens will be accessible during installment, with the exception of the footpath.

The public art project was proposed by the community at the Maribyrnong Community Strengths and Opportunities Workshop in August 2024.

The first round of consultation on the public artwork took place in April 2025. During this time, we sought ideas from community on words to reflect in the artwork.

A community workshop was held in July 2025 for community to provide feedback on the concept plan design and enable community voices to be reflected in the artwork.
