

WORKING WITH CONTRACTORS

Overview

You will likely engage contractors (and their sub-contractors) at some point during a project. Anyone who is paid via an ABN as a sole trader or incorporated entity (such as a company or unit trust) is deemed a contractor. This can include sole-trader staff such as crew or designers, supplier companies such as lighting or audio hire companies – pretty much anyone who is paid via invoice as opposed to via PAYG (employees).

As such, you need to take steps to ensure that your company/organization is protected as regards the actions of your contractors. You must insist that a contractor supply a certificate of currency for public liability insurance (at least \$10 million cover), to ensure that, in the extremely unlikely circumstance that a claim is made against your organization, the liability can be shared amongst all relevant parties, which may include contractors.

Relevant contractors should also supply a Risk Assessment or JSA (Job Safety Analysis) if the works they are undertaking for you involve hazardous scenarios. This is a legislated requirement and you can insist upon the supply of these documents.
